

## Nevada Voting Guide

### 2016 Registration Deadlines and Election Dates

#### Voter Registration Deadlines:

- Postmarked 31 days before the election—October 8
- Submitted online by 21 days before Election Day—October 18
- Received in-person at a clerk's office 21 days before Election Day—October 18

Election Day: November 8

#### What Type of ID Do I Need to Register?

Nevada's voter registration form asks for your Nevada driver's license or ID number, or the last four digits of your Social Security Number. Make sure you have it when completing your registration form.

#### What Type of ID Do I Need to Vote?

No ID is required to vote in Nevada.

#### Where Do I Vote?

## How Can I Vote?

### By Mail

- First-time voters who registered by mail or online can only vote absentee if they either (a) submit a written request for an absentee ballot that is signed by the registered voter before a notary public or other person authorized to administer an oath, or (b) request an absentee ballot in person at the county clerk's office.
- Voters wishing to vote by absentee ballot must request it from their local County Clerk's office. The [Absentee Ballot Request Form](#) must be received via mail or fax by your local county election official by the 7th day before a primary or general election.
- The absentee ballot itself must be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day.

### Early In Person

- Nevada allows early voting between the 3rd Saturday before a primary or general election through the Friday before Election Day (Sundays and federal holidays excluded).
- During this time period, Nevada voters may vote at any early voting location in their counties. Contact your [county clerk](#) to determine the appropriate early voting location.

### On Election Day

- The polls are open from 7 a.m. until 7 p.m.
